Dear Hunting Retriever Enthusiast:

Thank you for your interest and participation in the Western Colorado Hunting Retriever Club's 2025 UKC/HRC Licensed "Back-to-Back" Regular Hunt Test on *Saturday and Sunday, July 19th & 20th*. We sincerely hope that you will attend, enter your dogs, have success, and bring home some ribbons. However, most importantly, we hope that you have a safe and fun-filled weekend!

Western Colorado HRC will be holding our Hunt Test up in the Grand Mesa National Forest ("Grand Mesa") again this year. We think that this location will provide you with a true representation of what Western Colorado is all about. The unique, picturesque, environmental adventure that this location offers is one that you will be hard pressed to find with any other Hunt Test.

The Grand Mesa is an "oasis in the sky" and is the largest flattop mountain in the world. It is comprised of over 500 sq. miles of land, stretching east from Grand Junction, and bordered north and south by the Colorado and Gunnison Rivers. The Grand Mesa rises approximately 5000 vertical feet from the valley floors, up to altitudes of over 11,000 feet. It is an environment primarily of pines, aspens, and rolling grass fields. There are over 300 lakes and reservoirs, along with incredible wildlife viewing opportunities. To top all of this off, when temperatures tend to be 90-100(+) degrees in Grand Junction and everywhere else in July and August, it is typical for the temperatures up on the Grand Mesa to be in the 60's and 70's!

We highly recommend that you take advantage of this unique place. Come out and participate in our Hunt Test and then stay for as long as you want. There are an abundant number of camping options up on the Grand Mesa (of all types too) whether you bring your RV, stay in a cabin, or pitch a tent. There are also motels, hotels, and other accommodations in nearby Cedaredge, CO. Bring your hiking boots, your mountain bike, and your fishing pole – but, most of all, plan on enjoying the Grand Mesa!

ACCOMMODATIONS & CAMPING

The nearest town to the Grand Mesa National Forest, approximately 25-30 minutes (max.) down Highway 65 to the south, is Cedaredge, CO. If you don't stay up on the Grand Mesa; camping, in a cabin, in a condo/hotel at the Powderhorn Ski Area, or in a house rental; we recommend that you stay in Cedaredge. Other cities or towns a little further away that you could also consider for lodging, etc., are: Delta, CO (approx. 45 min.); Palisade, CO (approx. 45 min.); Grand Junction, CO (approx. 1 hr.); or, Hotchkiss, CO (approx. 1 hr.).

I-70 – WEST (from Denver and Front Range)

Take I-70 West towards Grand Junction, CO. Take Exit #62 at DeBeque, CO – "DeBeque Cut-Off" Road/45 ½ Road. Head south (up) towards Colbran, Grand Mesa, and Powderhorn Ski Area (12 miles to intersection with Hwy. 65). At the intersection with Hwy. 65, turn left, and take Hwy. 65 heading up through Mesa, CO, and onto Powderhorn Ski Area. Go past Powderhorn Ski Area, Mesa Lakes Resort, Skyway, Land's End Road (FS 100 Rd.), on to the "Mesa Top Trail" Parking Area.

I-70 - EAST (from Grand Junction)

Take I-70 East towards Denver, CO. Take Exit #49 – Colbran/Grand Mesa/Powderhorn Ski Area/Hwy. 65. Head south (up) towards Colbran, Grand Mesa, and Powderhorn Ski Area. At the intersection with Hwy. 330 (Colbran), stay right, and continue on Hwy. 65 heading up through Mesa, CO, and onto Powderhorn Ski Area. Go past Powderhorn Ski Area, Mesa Lakes Resort, Skyway, Land's End Road (FS 100 Rd.), on to the "Mesa Top Trail" Parking Area.

US-50 – WEST (from Southeast Colorado)

Take Hwy. US-50 to Delta, CO. Turn east onto Hwy. 92 towards Cedaredge/Hotchkiss for approx. 3.7 miles. Turn north onto Hwy. 65 to Cedaredge, CO. Continue on Hwy. 65 north through Cedaredge, and up onto the Grand Mesa. Continue past the Grand Mesa National Forest Visitor's Center, and on to the "Mesa Top Trail" Parking Area.

OTHER NOTES

General

The Grand Mesa National Forest is <u>YOUR</u> public land. Western Colorado HRC is fortunate to have the opportunity to hold our Hunt Test up on the Grand Mesa, and we very much would like the opportunity to be considered to hold future events in this incredible place. Additionally, per our Special Event Permit, our Club and its Members are personally and financially responsible for any damage done; so, please treat the Grand Mesa with respect, pick-up your trash and the trash of others, obey all laws/rules/regulations, park only in designated areas, respect fellow users of the land and resources (the Grand Mesa, again, is public land, and we don't have exclusive rights to it), do not smoke outdoors and extinguish all cigarettes in a proper place (fire danger is EXTREME!!!); and, as they say, "take only photos and leave only footprints".

Weather & Altitude

Though, we could go on for hours detailing everything you should bring for the Hunt Test (bring bug spray!), for camping if you are camping, and for the various other activities you may partake in during your adventure to the Grand Mesa, we wanted to make sure you were aware of the fact that the Grand Mesa is a mountainous area, and the weather could change for the worse quickly. It is not unheard of for the mountainous areas of Western Colorado to receive heavy snow, even in July. So, with that, please watch the weather closely, and please be prepared for any/all conditions.

Also, the Grand Mesa is high in elevation. During our event, you will be spending an ample amount of time near (or above) 10,000 feet in elevation. So, if you do have health concerns, especially related to altitude (and oxygen), we highly advise that you consult with your doctor before attending our event. Recommendations: #1 – please drink plenty of water and watch how much alcohol you consume (it will go to your head quickly); and, #2 – please bring plenty of sunscreen, as you are that much closer to the sun and can burn quickly.



DISPERSED CAMPING:

Campers go hunting, hiking, 4-wheeling, and horseback riding throughout the Forest in many areas where developed camping areas are not available. Finding a site to camp and enjoy these activities in remote areas or in relative solitude has become a popular form of camping throughout the Forest. At some more popular areas, minimal toilet facilities are provided. Contact the local Forest Service office for current information and refer to the Motor Vehicle Use Map (MVUM) for each area (Grand Mesa, Gunnison, and Uncompandere National Forests). Dispersed camping is permitted in most areas of the Forest. Some caution should be used in selecting a site because of intermingled private lands within the National Forest. Recreation maps are available at all local Forest Service offices. Personnel at each station can answer questions on specific sites. Unlike developed campgrounds which are designed and maintained to protect the vegetation, soils, and natural setting; camping in undeveloped areas require more from the camper to help keep the site in the condition in which it was found. Dispersed camping must not occur within 100 feet of water sources (rivers, streams, ponds, or wetlands) or within 100 feet of any road or system trail. In some areas, dispersed camping is restricted to specific sites, contact the local Forest Service office for current information. Campsites can be occupied for no more than 14 days, then the site must be moved at least 3 miles away. Camping is also limited to a total of 28 days in a 60 day period. The following are suggestions to help maintain these areas:

ACCESS: In areas closed to the use of vehicles off Forest roads, where developed parking sites are not provided, and where not otherwise prohibited, direct access to a suitable parking site within 300 feet of the road is permitted. Such travel must not damage the land or streams. Please select your route carefully, and do not cut live timber. Off road travel should be limited to when the ground is dry. The public is encouraged to camp in locations where others have previously camped and utilized existing routes (tow-track trails) to those camp areas. Campers are required to leave a clean camp, not to damage vegetation or pollute streams and lakes on the National Forest and implement "Leave No Trace" practices.

HUMAN WASTE: Human waste can affect water quality and pose a health risk to others. Use toilets where provided. In other areas select a suitable screened spot at least 200 feet away from open water. Dig a small hole 6 to 8 inches deep. After use, fill the hole with the loose dirt and tramp in the sod with your foot. Nature will dispose of the waste in a short time by a system of "biological disposers".

TRASH: All dispersed areas are managed on a "pack it in – pack it out" basis. Cans, bottles, aluminum foil, and anything that will not burn should be carried out. Paper and other burnable items should be burned in your campfire. Please do not bury garbage or trash, animals are prone to digging it up.

WATER: For short trips, take a supply of drinking water from home or from another domestic source. For longer trips, boiling water for a minimum of 5 minutes is the most effective treatment for giardia cysts and other water borne disease organisms. A longer boiling time may be required at higher elevations.

FIRE: Select a site away from low limbs and clear away needles, twigs and other ground litter to mineral soil. Dig a shallow pit and line it with rocks. Keep your fire only as large as needed to cook or heat with.

Never leave a fire unattended. When you are through with your fire pit make sure the ashes are dead cold out then bury the pit and disperse the rocks. Whenever a stove is available, we recommend its use. Campfires should be at least 100 feet from all lakes, streams, and National Forest System Trails and are not allowed at or above tree line.

BEAR AWARE: The GMUG is home to black bears, help discourage a bear encounter. Keep a clean camp. Store food, including stock and pet food and garbage in bear-proof containers. (Coolers and plastic boxes are not bear-proof.) Hang food in a tree 10 feet off the ground and 4 feet from the tree, if bear-proof containers are not available. Keep sleeping areas free of food and odors. Do not sleep in clothes worn while cooking or handling game or fish. NEVER INTENTIONALLY FEED A BEAR!
